

#### Step 2:

#### **Option 1: Draw an Arch:**

The below representation of an arch can be used to visualise each element of your rewilding project. Each brick is of equal importance, without any one of them the structure would not stand. Roughly draw an arch-shaped structure, divide it into 9 bricks like the one below and add the name for each theme. You can put a tick in each brick when you have completed the theme on the form above.



#### **Option 2: Assemble the Rewilding Paper Model**

Materials required:

- A printer
- 9 A4 sheets of card (if not paper will do)
- Scissors
- Glue
- Ruler (optional)

#### How to assemble the individual bricks:


You should have 8 regular sized bricks and one slightly larger keystone brick

- 1) Cut along the outer line of the net and the two inner lines with a scissor symbol
- 2) Fold along the lines a ruler may be helpful here to get straight folds
- 3) The design should be on the outside of the brick so check that you are folding the brick in the right direction
- 4) Add glue to each tab that says 'glue' and 'A' and fasten these to the inside of the brick as you fold it. You might need to carefully pinch the sides together
- 5) Be careful to keep the 'B' tabs on the outside of the brick (these will be used to secure the brick to the next one)
- 6) Hopefully you now have a brick!


#### How to assemble the overall structure:


- 1) Congratulations for completing each step! You should now have 9 bricks, which includes 8 regular sized bricks and 1 slightly wider keystone brick
- 2) You are now ready to assemble the arch
- 3) Starting with the human inhabitants brick, make sure your bricks are in the right order (as shown on your form)
- 4) Apply glue to the top sides of the two 'B' tabs that we did not glue in the previous steps
- 5) Get the next brick and stick these tabs to the bottom of that brick. Note: the small side of the brick should be at the bottom and the wider side at the top.
- 6) Repeat the process it is possible, though more challenging, to do this on your own. The human inhabitant and ecologist could cooperate to assemble the structure together or if you are completing the project on your own you could ask someone else to help you
- 7) Once you have completed each step you should end up with an arch, symbolising your rewilding project!

## 1 Human Inhabitants Brick Net




## 2 Human Advocate Brick Net







# 4 Ecological Assessment Brick Net





# 5 Keystone: Minimal Intervention Brick Net
